Practice Your Scouting Skills on this Beautiful National Trust Estate



There are already strong links between the Scouting movement and the National Trust, which jointly sponsors the Cubs Naturalist Badge.

16th Sheffield (Westbourne) have been working with the team at Hardwick Hall, a local national trust property near Chesterfield, to design a resource pack for beavers, cubs and scouts visiting the site to enjoy scouting activities and work towards badges when they visit. Beavers can work towards their Explore activity badge, Cubs towards their Naturalist and Local Knowledge badges and Scouts towards their Naturalist and Forester badges.

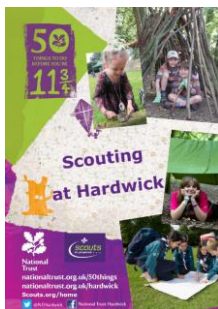
